Several changes have occurred with the staff this past month. Gary Gilham, our Food Pantry director, resigned effective May 3rd. As food pantry employees have been paid through grants and donations and it's currently more difficult to find grants, we no longer have the necessary funds to fill Gary's position. Jon Weed, who has been our Food Pantry assistant, has agreed to step up as Food Pantry Coordinator. We've increased his hours so he can supervise the day to day running of the pantry including Saturday distribution, as well as attend pertinent meetings, etc. In addition, we are setting up a Food Pantry Committee to coordinate other needed jobs in order to keep the pantry running smoothly. We will be looking for volunteers to assist with these needs.

There has also been a staff change with Sunbeam Children's Center. Teresa Rook, the assistant director, retired effective May 23rd. Gasna Thomas has agreed to serve as interim assistant director. SPRC, in conjunction with the SCC Board, will be looking at this position. All SCC employees are also employees of St. Thomas UMC, and the positions of Director and Assistant Director are directly overseen by SPRC.

Pastor Matt is starting his third year with our church. The Committee continues to feel that St. Thomas is blessed to have him. And one other staff "change" is Kristi Swanson is officially both the Children's and Youth Director. And we are also blessed to have her.


Ladies Book Club

The Ladies Book Group will meet on June 13th at 10:30 am in Room 304 to discuss THE CURIOUS INCIDENT OF THE DOG IN THE NIGHT-TIME.

Christopher is "on the spectrum" and when he discovers a dead dog in his yard, he is compelled to solve the mystery. Along the way, we learn the joys and challenges facing Christopher. Author Haddon has worked with "special" children in both a school and a medical setting and brings knowledge, expertise and empathy to the novel.

On July 11th, we will discuss PEOPLE OF THE BOOK by Geraldine Brooks. Brooks, a Pulitzer Prize winning author, relates the possible history of a 15th century Haggadah beautifully illustrated in a manner unusual for the time period. When the rare book is preserved and presented for restoration after the shelling of Sarajevo's library, a number of tiny artifacts are discovered in the books binding leading the books restorer to speculate on the books history.
