

Volunteers Needed

A few hours is all it takes to help raise awareness and eliminate hunger in our community. Every time you volunteer with the food pantry of St. Thomas United Methodist Church, you know that you have helped put food on the table of our neighbors in need and that you helped to support the community you live in. Volunteering can provide a healthy boost to your self-confidence, self-esteem, and life satisfaction. You are doing good for others and the community, which provides a natural sense of accomplishment. Your role as a volunteer can also give you a sense of pride and identity. This is especially important for our youth of today. It's a great way to reinforce kindness and compassion for others. We have several different levels of involvement and many different kinds of volunteer opportunities.

DRIVERS:

Regular Driver: Pick up at designated grocery stores and deliver donated items to the Food Pantry. This would
be 1-2 times each week in the morning. A large vehicle is helpful and the church van is available if you are on
the insurance list.

FOOD PANTRY VOLUNTEERS:

- 9:00 am to approximately 12:00 (occasionally later). Tuesday, Thursday and Friday mornings. Help unload food that's delivered, sort food and put away. At the end of the morning please help sweep and wipe down tables, etc.
- Saturday: 8:30-12:00 includes;
- Intake for Saturday morning, intake done by computer. Some training is require but can be done on Saturday morning.
- Assist wit food distribution.
- Translate for none English speaking persons. Must be fluent in both English and Spanish-but not necessary to volunteer but is very helpful.
- Senior Citizen program: (Contact Karl Becker or Janie Russell) this requires;
- Assisting with packing boxes for delivery to senior citizens. This is done on Thursdays from 1:30-3:00.
- Assist with delivering the food to people in the Manassas area. Approximately 3:00-4:30. This requires a two people team, one of whom must be able to lift and carry the boxes of food. Since we are going into homes, it's also required that the delivery people and drivers are known to St. Thomas. We currently have two teams.


