Safety and Security at St. Thomas

St. Thomas UMC has been blessed to be a relatively safe campus for our church activities and worship services for many years. However, places of worship across America and in Prince William Co. [Park Valley Church in Haymarket] have been potential targets. In the last few years, there have been a number of violent incidents at places of worship throughout the nation. These occurrences can create a sense of fear and uncertainty.

While there are no known threats to St. Thomas, the Safety Committee continues to review and adopt strategies that enhance the safety and security of our campus. We look at measures that will help to mitigate threats. In this regard, one such measure the Safety Committee has been discussing with the Church Council is having an off-duty police officer at the church on Sunday mornings. Several churches in western Prince William County have a similar program in place today.

As a result of this discussion, on April 24, the Church Council approved an 8-week Police Officer Pilot Program for Sunday mornings at St. Thomas UMC. A police officer present on Sunday mornings provides;

- A First Responder presence in the event of a threat or other emergency
- Contact and Collaboration with other responding police officers
- Experience and training to a crisis situation
- For the safety of the congregation and brings reassurance
- An additional measure of support to the Church safety program
- A connection between our Church family and First Responders

The Safety Committee will be holding informational sessions on Sunday mornings with the congregation about the police officer program. The location of the sessions will be announced in woeship. In addition, the Safety Committee will be available to address questions and concerns from our St. Thomas family during the pilot program. We anticipate starting the pilot program in the very near future. This information is being provided now to advise you about the forthcoming pilot program. As we move forward we will keep you informed.

Following the completion of the Pilot Program, we will pause the program, and conduct extensive listening sessions with the Congregation to seek feedback on whether the Sunday morning police officer program should be continued. Survey tools will be used as well. Once we have collected feedback, the Church Council will discuss the Police Officer program and make a determination if the program will continue this year and/or into 2026. The estimated cost of the pilot program is \$2,000.


The Tweens will have a busy month planning their April meeting a little later on May 1 when they will do Time Mission, an escape room style experience at Manassas Mall. They will have a
