Sunday Lenten Study

The season of Lent encourages Christians to consider a different pace; one of slowing down, noticing, pausing. This short-term class for Lent will be based on the book "Pause: Spending Lent with the Psalms" by Elizabeth Caldwell. This book invites us to deeply engage with one psalm each week during Lent and Holy Week. Each psalm is paired with a theme and a suggested prayer practice to help us reflect on the psalm and theme. The book is available in paperback from Cokesbury for \$13.99 or the ebook version can be purchased from Kindle for \$11.99 or Barnes & Noble for \$11.49. Since this study is based on Psalms, it is not absolutely necessary to purchase a book and it is will be easy to jump back into the discussion if you miss a Sunday. The class will meet at 10am on Sundays starting Feb. 4 and continuing through Palm Sunday. Holly Banner and Pat Brown are leading this class.

Weekday Lenten Study

This Lenten study will further explore Pastor Matt's Worship series, "Forward in Faith". These Wednesday evening sessions will include a Communion Service, followed by a simple dinner and further discussion on the scripture text and sermon from the previous Sunday. 
Lenten Devotional



Thanks for Your Support of Our El Salvador Mission

On January 13, 2024, our team of 13 returned from a mission trip to Ahuachapan in El Salvador. The team was a combination of members from St. Thomas UMC and Haymarket Church in addition to several relatives and friends.



Since 2012, our two churches have developed relationships and equipped and sent more than 12 teams to Ahuachapan in El Salvador to do construction work, feeding program, or to run a Vacation Bible School or medical clinic in partnership with the Methodist Church community there. At the same time, our teams brought with them funds raised by the team members here in the U.S. in partnership with our two congregations in Manassas and Haymarket.

The funds and the volunteer work done in Ahuachapan by our teams have helped support the above mentioned mission projects. One of them has been construction of a Methodist school in Ahuachapan that has grown from 18 students in 2014 to 583 in 2024. It holds kids from preschool through high school and is one of the best performing schools in the country. And most of all, it is for the glory of God, it is safe and free of gangs and it is free for families who cannot afford to pray tuition. In the words of a couple of St. Thomas members who volunteered in El Salvador in January 2024, "My time this year in El Salvador was different than the last. With all of my family and having worked on the school instead of doing VBS, the experience filled my spirit in different ways. I got to connect more with the construction workers even with our limited English/Spanish skills. I was able to see our physical progress at the end of the week and loved to hear about the impact of St. Thomas's work over the decade in Ahuachapán." Members and friends of St. Thomas and Haymarket congregations have been directly or indirectly involved with this God's work of relationship building with the community in Ahuachapan and the impact there.

For the time being, we are focusing on supporting the school growth as well as a construction of a new college for nurses so terribly needed in that region. The Community Clothes Closet (CCC) is going into their 4th year of clothing those in need in our community! In 2023 we clothed an average of 80 families each week we were open. We provided clothing to 2074 families and 6942 individuals.

Current needs through March are still winter clothing like sweats and long sleeve shirts, and especially children's clothing and shoes, sizes 5-10 years.


Dorcas Circle
