

## **START Mission Trip - October 2023**

On Sunday, October 8, sixteen people left their homes bound for New Bern, NC to do a weeklong mission trip with Baptists on Mission. Many people came from St. Thomas UMC, but some came from other areas. The most distant team member came from Ohio and is a former member of St. Thomas. We arrived in New Bern around dinner time and got settled in to our bunks and accommodations.




On Monday morning, we met with Mark and Joy Pickett, our hosts for the week. After welcoming our team, Mark set about giving us some background information on the family we would be serving for the week. He advised that this family had been helped after the storm (Hurricane Florence) and he tries to keep up with people who have received assistance from Baptists on Mission. When he checked on Steve and Kathy (the homeowners), he found their home had received significant damage from a house fire and was currently uninhabitable. Steve and Kathy were sleeping in their car beside their burned out house. Apparently, an electrical issue had sparked the fire. Steve had been seriously burned during the fire

and had received treatment in the burn unit of a hospital. In the next days, Steve and Kathy met with Mark to discuss whether Baptists on Mission would be able to help them recover from the fire. Mark reports they were overwhelmed; unsure of where to go and what to do to get their lives back together after the fire. He says they had pretty much lost hope that they could live as they did before the fire and neither of them were in a good frame of mind at this meeting.

Mark decided that Baptists on Mission would try to help them with repairs to the home. Mark reports that he told Steve and Kathy that he did not know where the money for building materials would come from, but he would trust in the Lord that adequate funding would be found. Mark was able to secure temporary housing for them by arranging for a travel trailer to be set up beside their damaged home. Mark then set about coming up with a plan to get the home put back in livable condition. An engineer was consulted to determine if the home could be rebuilt and the conclusion was that it could be done, but would require plenty of labor, materials, as well as coordination with the county building inspector's office.




At the time, Mark had two teams scheduled to come to New Bern, the first being the NC Friends (Quakers). They are excellent carpenters and framed out many houses our team worked on during previous mission trips in both North Carolina and Virginia. After they completed their week's



work removing debris and framing the house, our team was scheduled to come in to take up where they left off. We completed the roof, integrating the new shingles with the existing ones which remained undamaged. The entire interior had been gutted down to the studs, including removal of all wiring in the house and all plumbing above the level of the crawl space. We roughed in a new electrical system in the house and insulated the walls and part of the ceiling. Additionally, a local volunteer worked with us on roughing in the new plumbing system. We also made some structural additions to the framing so there would be solid wood to secure the kitchen cabinets as well as other items. After an inspection by the local Building Inspector, we were allowed to

close in many of the walls with drywall and continue with insulation in other areas. We began to install the ceiling around the edge of the rooms so that the air conditioning ducts could be installed. By the end of the week, we had made very significant progress toward the goal of getting Steve and Kathy back in their home. We had a good test of the roof with a significant rain in the middle of the week and we found no leaks in the roof after the rain.



Throughout the week, we interacted with Steve and Kathy and became more comfortable with each other as the week progressed. On Friday evening, we invited them to come to the recovery center to share a meal with us. They were a very entertaining couple and we all enjoyed sharing some time with them. They were very animated in their conversation and appeared to be really enjoying the attention we were giving them.

After they departed for the night, Mark contrasted

their demeanor that evening with their demeanor when he first met with them where they seemed to have lost hope. They were initially very reserved with little hope things would get better for them. After two teams had made great progress on their home, their attitude had changed completely. We had given them hope that things would get better. That is our primary goal during these mission trips. The construction work is very important, but the real goal of our work is to restore hope to people who are devastated by disaster.



As many of you know, we raised funds before we left on this trip. A large part of this fund raising was a Tuesday Night Dinner two weeks before we departed. This fundraising event resulted in approximately \$3,500.00 after expenses to be used for building material purchases during our trip. We thank the entire Kitchen Ministry team for their help during this event which was a significant part of our fundraising effort.

In addition to this amount, many of our team members made significant donations to this fund. In the end, we left for New Bern, with \$5,146.00 to use for building materials and other expenses incurred by the team. This does not include the cost of food, transportation, or lodging for the trip,

which were borne by each member of the team.

Before we completed our week in New Bern, I talked to Mark about the funding situation for the entire project, particularly after his statement that he was unsure of how it would be funded to its completion. He had applied for a grant through Lowe's in New Bern and was awarded a \$2,500.00 grant for building materials. I asked him where that left him for total funding and he replied that he only had one more major expense that he didn't know how he was going to fund. That major expense was the kitchen cabinets and the estimate for materials was \$4,700.00. It looked like the Lord had again provided because I was able to tell him that St. Thomas was able to fund these items.

I see the Lord's hand in this entire project. When we did our fundraising, I had no idea of the actual amount which would be needed to complete the project. The amount of money we received was almost EXACTLY the amount we would later learn would be needed. Coincidence? I think not! When we needed certain skills, there was someone who had those skills. When we needed to work longer hours to complete the roof because of predicted rain, we put the last nail in the roof as the sun was going down and it began to rain on our way back to the recovery center. It rained hard that night and

there were no leaks when we arrived the next morning. Even though it was raining that morning, all the work we had to do that day was inside work. Everything seemed to fit together perfectly.

Although I would love to take credit for things working out so well, it was obviously the Lord and his divine intervention over the whole project that made everything work out well. It was certainly due to more than just skillful planning or coincidence! God is good!!

We would like to thank the congregation for their tremendous support of our team; both financially and prayerfully. Your prayers were felt during the entire week and we saw them being answered each day. Many thanks to all of you.

We welcome anyone who would like to be a part of this amazing mission effort. All skill levels are welcome. All we ask is that you have a willing servant's heart. If you feel that you lack the skills to join us, we will help you find a task that you can complete and contribute to the overall effort in a significant way. Please consider joining us.
