

Local Relief On Hold for January

Our Local Relief program has been an invaluable resource for our community, particularly during the pandemic and the recovery. We have always helped with funds donated by the congregation, but during the recovery from the pandemic we were able to help many more people through government grant money entrusted to us. At this time, the grant money has all been dispersed, but there are still many in need. Unfortunately, our available Local Relief funds are low, and the team has decided to suspend appointments for the month of January. Under our current guidelines (up to 4 appointments per week, with financial assistance of up to \$250), we generally give out around \$3500 to \$4000 a month. We hope to restart appointments in February, if sufficient funds have been donated.

As we start the new year, the Staff Parish Committee is looking forward to continuing to support Pastor Matt and the rest of our staff. We are so thankful for our excellent staff. We especially are grateful for the many services and activities during the Christmas season. The Church services, the music, the children's programs, the food, including the Christmas Day Dinner, were all exceptional and added to the holiday spirit. The feeling of unity and love was certainly apparent during this time.

The staff, including the office volunteers, met for lunch on Friday, December 22nd at The Publick House in downtown Manassas. The lunch included good food, excellent service, and lots of good conversation and laughs. A gift exchange only added to the fun.



SPRC is currently working on hiring a full-time director for the Food Pantry. We will also look at ways to offer further assistance and support to our staff. We hope parishioners will take the opportunity to express their thanks when they see a job well done.




