

## **New Logo Revealed!**

When the 2020-2022 Strategic Plan was endorsed at the end of 2019, a new mission statement was adopted:

#### St. Thomas UMC exists to reach, nourish, and serve the community so all may experience healing and new life through Jesus Christ.

Typically, the leadership would have developed a new logo at that time to correspond with this new direction; however, we were in the midst of helping to launch a new faith community in Haymarket that shared the existing brand. Leadership felt this was not the best time to create a new logo.

With Haymarket Church successfully launching as an independent faith community in July 2021, St. Thomas could now consider rebranding. The Communications Committee sought several quotes and discovered that the cost was rather steep. So, we waited to move forward. When SPRC contracted with Jillian Phiffer through the Marketing on Retainer (MOR) program at the end of March, we were able to revisit logo development. Over the past few months, Pastor Abi worked with the Communications Committee, Front Porch Team, Lay Leaders and Staff to research and finetune several logo concepts that would capture the spirit of our community.

At their May meeting, the Church Council approved the logo



(seen at the top right of this page) and MOR will now start integrating the new logo with our website, printed materials, and other giveaways.

The logo is inspired by the story of Noah's Ark that the SPARK Team identified as a key biblical story for the community of St. Thomas at this point in our ministry, as the shape looks like the helm of an ark or boat. The cross is central to the design and is similar in shape to the two crosses in our Sanctuary (the stained glass window cross and the wooden cross hanging from the ceiling). The design behind the cross illustrates a crossroads of sorts reminiscent of our location as a church at the corner of Sudley and Grant. And yet, the cross radiates light to illumine the community, reminding all that it is through Christ we experience healing and new life!

The colors of the logo are inspired by those in our stained glass window, which speak to our baptism in Christ (dark and light blues) as well as our service to the community and beyond through the Holy Spirit (Orange).

Thank you to all who helped us arrive at this key decision.

## Team Explores Establishing a Non-Profit



June 5th is also a Day of Pentecost when our four confirmands will be baptized/confirmed. We will have


