Helping Our Neighbors

The St. Thomas Local Relief (or Benevolence) Fund is used to help our neighbors in the Manassas & Manassas Park area who need limited, short-term help with expenses such as rent or utilities. Last fall, the process was revised and formalized. Now, when requests for assistance are received, either from someone who comes into the church or calls the office, the office staff or volunteer asks for basic information on their location, need and contact number. If we are able to help, we offer an appointment with the Local Relief Team. Currently, three appointments are available each week on Thursdays. Pastor Abi or Leslie Oakes have been handling these appointments, but they are training additional volunteers to assist (Many thanks to Ron Campbell & Becky Kilby! If you would like to join the Team, contact the Church Office). During the appointment, the Team member will discuss the situation, confirm whether or not we can help with some financial assistance and, if appropriate, provide referrals to other agencies that may be able to help with more complex situations. We always provide information on the Food Pantry and give immediate food supplies if needed.

If you are ever approached by someone here at the church asking for assistance, you can refer them to the office, Monday through Friday, 9am to 5pm, to schedule the next available appointment. Thank you for supporting the Local Relief Fund – your contributions provide help, and hope, to many in our local community.


Letter from the Senior Pastor

On the heels of celebrating our 25th anniversary of worshipping together as a community of faith in our current sanctuary at the beginning of the month, we move directly into the season of Lent with our Pancakes and Ashes event and Ash Wednesday services on March 5 and 6 respectively (see page 3). Historically, Lent is a time for evangelism and for true conversion – a time for growing through repentance, fellowship, prayer, fasting and focus on the covenant that is made at our baptism. We are called to be a sign of hope that God’s kingdom is breaking forth in our world all the time. Lent then becomes a season not for giving something up but rather for taking upon ourselves the intention and receptivity to God’s grace. In other words – it’s not about giving up chocolate for 6 weeks but instead it’s about taking on the practice of prayer more intentionally so that I may love others more like Christ loves others. As we shift our priorities and spiritual practices in these ways, we prepare to participate in the mystery of God-with-us as Christ moves from his own baptism into the period of 40 days in the desert that ultimately leads him to towards the cross.

This is why Confirmation typically occurs during the season of Lent. This year, 5 or our youth in 6th through 9th grades are participating in the process of Confirmation. This process involves meeting together for 7 sessions between February and May, attending worship services of two other faith communities outside our tradition with their families, serving at the Food Pantry, participating in weekly worship and services during Holy Week, and helping to lead worship on Youth Sunday on May 5, and meeting with their mentor throughout this season of preparation. This year, Confirmation will culminate on Sunday, May 19 and I would ask that between now and then you bathe our Confirmands and the whole

experience in prayer. May God enlighten their journey as they move into a fuller understanding of the life of faith.

And, finally, during Lent we will be exploring some of the questions that God asks us throughout the witness of Scripture. You may not realize that there are 183 questions that Jesus was asked in the four Gospels, and yet he only directly answered three of them! When we think Christianity provides us with clear answers, we might consider



that Jesus saw things differently! Perhaps by asking us questions in response to those we raise, Jesus wanted us to know that God values what we think and feel. And more importantly, any conversation that draws us deeper into a more intimate relationship with him will never be time wasted.


On the day after General Conference passed moving forward with the Traditional Plan and some United Methodists celebrated while others wailed in mourning, we may find solace in seeing the value of being asked questions by God and one another. Certainly, questions have the power to transform us more than a straightforward answer because we have to wrestle with what we believe and why we believe it. Questions invite me to look more deeply and honestly into my heart and they have a way of changing us from the inside out. May we continue to seek the adventure that awaits us, knowing that God is with us through it all.



PRESCHOOL: Made

BOTTOM LINE: God made me.

ELEMENTARY: Made

God is one of a kind. Everything He has created is unique and one of-a-kind, including people created in His image. Every person is an original reflection of God in how they love, care for others, imagine, create, and solve problems. Jesus lived this out in the way He loved all people, and helped people feel like they had value no matter who they were or what they had done. We can reflect this in the way we live out how God created us.

BOTTOM LINE: Individuality is a reflection of the character of God.
