START Mission Trip to Jones County, NC

During the week of June 6-12, 2021, the STUMC START team traveled to Jones County, NC to continue with our disaster recovery efforts in that area. The team was made up of 15 people from our Manassas Campus, Haymarket Church, as well other churches.

Unfortunately, UMCOR has ceased operations in North Carolina. The recovery effort is now being led by Rice and Beans Ministry, an international relief agency. They are currently working in Costa Rica and Brazil and were looking for an opportunity to serve domestically. When UMCOR ceased operations, that opportunity was provided. Their founder, Fred Curry, contacted Stephanie Hunt, the area coordinator for UMCOR and offered to continue the work UMCOR could not complete. There remains much work to be done in this area.

We were housed at The Father's Refuge, a Christian retreat center in an old high school. Our area was a summer youth camp located behind the school with open air bunk rooms in a very rustic wooded setting. Everyone really enjoyed this camp setting. We also had a small team from Statesville, NC housed there. We made arrangements with them to share meals and morning devotions. Interacting with other teams like this is one of the pleasures of doing short term mission work. (Cont. on page 2)



STUMC has served in the Coastal NC area for many years and the Jones County area, specifically, since Hurricane Florence came through in 2018. This storm stalled over the entire area once it came ashore and dumped huge quantities of rain. Many of the homes here were flooded and this has been the focus of our service in this area. Some of the homes our teams previously repaired are in the same neighborhood we were serving in on this trip. It was good seeing the area slowly repaired one home at a time. Eventually, we hope to repair all storm damage in this small community.

We had three major tasks during this trip. We replaced the roof on one home, replaced an exterior door on another, and replaced the vinyl siding on a third home. The first two projects were completed and the siding job was about 75% complete when we left. Another team arrived several hours after we left and were ready to pick up where we left off.





We had significant weather related obstacles during our week. The heat was in the mid nineties during the day while we were working and this made frequent water breaks necessary. We also had a few downpours during the week. We quickly tarped the roof and took shelter until the storm passed. We were advised that this is typical weather for Eastern NC during the late spring.



At the end of the week, many participants reported feeling that we "got more than we gave". All of us reported having a positive experience interacting with other team members, homeowners, and teams from other areas. We all want to return later this year. We are always looking for new team members. If this sounds appealing to you, please consider joining up with us on the next trip. No particular skills are required. All we ask is that you have a willing servant's heart and we will help you with the rest. Please consider serving with us.

Food Pantry Updates

June has been a busy month for the Food Pantry and our continuing mission to reach, nourish, and serve the community. We partnered with Patricia Aldas, one of our regular volunteers that works for United Health Care; brought a mobile dental van and coordinated our first health fair. With the dental van we were able to provide dental screenings for 24 kids and during our health fair we were able to administer 34 COVID vaccines. Patricia was able to help us line up different healthcare partners to provide blood pressure screening, help with Medicaid applications and new information about benefits, new information for pregnant mom's, some mental health education, and Mason and Partners to provide COVID



vaccines. We had a nice turn out and were able to send everyone home with some beautiful fresh produce from the farmer's market.

Over the past couple of months, the Kauffman family has blessed St Thomas in so many ways. They have

worked with our food pantry to find projects that Michael and Noah



could use as their Eagle Scout projects.

Noah's project was to build 3 new picnic tables and clean out some of the flower beds around the church. The picnic tables are used by the children at Sunbeam, youth group, church members, and even members from the community to sit and

have picnics, group meetings, and for just enjoying some time together.

Michael's project was to complete needed general maintenance in the food pantry building. He worked carefully with the food pantry team to empty the



food pantry so the floors could be cleaned and repainted. He and his team then helped reorganize the food pantry shelves as they returned the items back into the food pantry during their 2-day project.

We would like to welcome Chrissy Fauls, Founder of WHY Incorporated, to St Thomas Food Pantry team. Chrissy has been working for the past year to bring food to those families affected by COVID in our community. She and Jhenny have partnered together on several projects, and we are very excited to have her join the team as an intermediate Food Pantry Assistant. Never one to shy away from hard work and tough conversations, Chrissy is a go-to name in this area for anyone who needs to get help, get connected, find resources, or for an



organization to reach the larger community. Chrissy's gift for connection and her heart for her community will make her an invaluable part of our team.

Volunteers are truly the heart and soul of the food pantry. Over the past 14 years we have been able to continue serving the community and feeding those in need because of the volunteers that have continued to help us. Please join us on July 18th for an open house at the food pantry. Come see all the changes and find out more about the different volunteer opportunities available. We will be there at 10 am for anyone that would like to stop by after the traditional service, and at Noon after the contemporary service. Hope to see you there!

May found us packing more health kits for the homeless. Thanks to the Friday Night Small Group, we were able to pack 104 health kits. Sixty-two of these kits were delivered to the Conference Collection point on June 19th. They will go out to different agencies in the area. (Ex. Rising Hope) The others will be kept on reserve and used when needed for various groups. We also sent \$200 to the United Methodist Conference for various missions.

The Mission school in El Salvador has an initiative to provide chromebooks for the teachers. We sent \$1000 of their \$10,000 goal. This is the school where many of our mission teams have worked. Teachers had been using their phones to teach the children virtually. The chromebooks will be a great asset.

Our Christmas in June toy drive was a great success. You provided nearly 300 toys to bless many children this Christmas. Thank you for your generosity.



We also sent \$600 to

Guatalmala (Rachael & Nolo) to help pay for sinus surgery for a little boy named Levi.

Our Food Pantry served 1023 families and had 439 volunteers for May. The Clothes Closet continues to be open twice a month. Volunteers are needed to sort the clothes during the week and distribute the clothes on the designated Saturdays. As a congregation we provided rent assistance, medical and utility bills, auto repairs and cribs — and even something as simple as a bag of groceries. We all knew that the gifts to the Pastor's Relief Fund were to be given in addition to our offering for the budgeted operating expenses of the church. This is just one example of the many ways that God multiplied our love through mission and ministry, local and worldwide that were supported in our early years.

Every church has an identity for which it is known. Saint Thomas' identity was that of a giving and serving church. The church may have been small, but it was mighty in its works.

Looking at today and going forward, that ember of love and concern for our neighbors, community, country and the world has grown through the guidance of the Spirit of our Living Lord, into a brilliant flame of hope and help. One has only to look at the work of our Mission Committee, the START team, Local Relief (formerly known as Pastor's Relief Fund), Food Pantry and VBS to name just a few, to feel the magnitude of this outreach effort. Also, the UMW supports various missions from their income and our Sunbeam Children's Center (which is fully self-sustaining) budgets for some tuition assistance in cases of unexpected hardship. Thanks to each of you for your support and efforts to allow all of this to happen.

The Permanent Endowment Committee has a dream that as we go forward, we can build up a **Mission Endowment Fund** that, as it grows, the fund's principle would be restricted but the income from appreciation, interest and dividends could support even greater callings in the field of mission, thus sustaining our long-standing legacy of hope and help.
