

Endowment Giving

Endowment giving consists of those contributions received at any time with the intention of funding a specific purpose or mission. By definition, an endowment is a fund where the principal amount of the contribution is preserved and invested. This creates an income flow such as appreciation, interest and/or dividends which is then used to fund those specific purposes or mission projects of our church. Investments are usually made through the Virginia United Methodist Foundation.

By the **Guidelines for the Permanent Endowment Program**, contributions may be assigned to any of these four recognized categories:

1. Mission Funds (for missions in and beyond the local church and community)
2. Property Funds (for maintenance, care, improvements or additions to, or construction of physical facilities)
3. General Endowment Funds (for special needs and ministries determined by the church leadership)
4. Scholarship Endowment Funds

When a donor makes a contribution to the Endowment they indicate whether it is a **designated** or **undesignated** gift. So, what does this mean? It is really very simple.

A **designated** gift means that the contribution is given for the intended use of one of the four categories above and the church is restricted to that specific use.

An **undesignated** gift means that the contribution may be assigned by the Permanent Endowment Committee to any of the four categories and that the church is unrestricted in its use within the categories.

In future editions of the Triumph, we will look deeper into each of the four categories and how an endowment may be used to benefit the mission and ministry of the church within that particular area.

El Salvador Mission

Our church has been supporting the El Salvador mission project for about a decade. Our teams have met people in their homes while delivering food, operated a medical clinic, taught a Children's Bible School and helped build homes & churches, working alongside local people. During our last mission trip in Nov 2019 (not possible during 2020 COVID) we helped build a huge Christian High School.

We hope and pray the Christian High School will provide educational and spiritual nourishment to the young in El Salvador so that they can find better alternatives at home rather than attempting dangerous trips to the USA border.

One missionary said, "traveling to Ahuachapan, directly meeting and working with the people, helps to dispel cultural stereotypes on both sides". We typically travel in November, returning before Thanksgiving.

We don't know if we can travel in 2021 due to COVID but we continue to raise funds for the mission.

You can financially support directly by sending funds to St Thomas UMC with "El Salvador Mission" designation.

Look for Jhenny Michalek's authentic and "famous" Pupusas for sale the next time her family offers them! They are a delicious treat very common in El Salvador.

For fundraising, we do home service projects for anyone in need and ask for whatever level of contribution you can offer. Some examples are yard cleanup, painting, furniture moving, fences, drywall, minor elec/plumbing/carpentry, house & pet sitting, and computer assistance.

Worship & Sunday School

This summer, we encourage families to make worshipping together with the body of Christ a priority – whether you join us for in-person gatherings beginning June 6 at 11am, or virtually through our livestream at both 9 am and 11 am. Worship is essential to our relationship with Christ and to having a healthy and growing faith.

During the months of June and July, Sunday School will be taking a break to give our leaders time to rest and to set up hybrid supports in our various classrooms so that when we return in the fall, we'll be able to offer both in-person and virtual gatherings at the same time.

We are also excited to share that Kristi Swanson, our Nursery Coordinator, will be helping to lead a newly developed ministry to help support families that may be traveling and on the go this summer after a long period of being cooped up from the pandemic. Read more about it below!

Kristi's Prayground

Each week on Tuesday mornings at 10 AM beginning Tuesday, June 22, we will make content available on our Facebook page and website. Families will be able to watch the video or download audio files – whichever works better for you and your family to listen or watch whenever it's convenient for You!

Kristi will record a faith-based story and a brief devotion based on the story for the day along with a short prayer and several prompts for families on the go. Her first story will be I Like Myself by Karen Beaumont and she'll share how God made all of us and loves us as we are.

Next, she'll read The Very Busy Spider by Eric Carle and share about the importance of making time for prayer and fellowship - even when there are LOTS of other things to do. Popsicles & Play

Families bring your children to the church playground either before or after worship on Sunday mornings, June 20 and July 18, from 10:00 – 10:45 AM. This is a great time for parents and care providers to have fellowship with one another while your children play safely outside on the playground. We'll provide some cool popsicles as a special treat before we wrap up the morning.

Summer Camps

Registration for summer camps is underway on our website (stthomasumc.org/summercamps.html).

Our camps, organized around one common theme each week, are specifically tailored to meet the developmental needs of 6 to 8-year-olds and 9 to 11-year-olds. Each day, campers will experience games, crafts, friendly competitions, and a variety of new experiences and outdoor play all around the theme for the week. Each camp is limited to 36 campers, split into four smaller groups of nine campers each. In addition to camp staff, master educators help lead the themed curriculum daily. Hours of operation are from 9 am – 4 pm, Monday – Friday, with after care options available until 5 pm. Cost of the camps is \$150 weekly and an additional \$25 for aftercare, with a 10% discount for siblings.
