Anatomy of a Website

What's in our website? Can you find what you're looking for? Well here is an easy guide to everything in our website.

To begin, our web address is **stthomasumc.org**! The home page depicts a banner at the top of the page that features rotating images of key ministries and events. Typically, you'll see a welcome to worship, the current sermon series, children's ministries and our food pantry as anchor images; plus other special events as they come and go. The banner images are clickable and designed to spark your interest.

When you scroll down our home page, you will then see three smaller pictures that are labelled CONNECT, GROW, SERVE. You can click on any one of the images to learn more about what these 3 areas of ministry have to offer and how to plug in as a newcomer. These will be explained in more detail later in this article. Scroll some more to find pertinent details about worship times and styles; and scroll to the bottom of the home page to see the 3 events that are happening next on our calendar. You can also go to the specific Events page to see all the upcoming events that are in the line up!

Now scroll back up to the very top of the page. You will see a small navigation menu with drop down options and clickable links:

The label says "drying". The second shelf is for general kitchen use and is labeled: "general use". If you need to deep clean something or wipe a spill from the floor please use the towels labeled: "heavy cleaning" and are located in the cupboard to the left of the towel cupboard. We are hoping to get a longer use out of our towels this way.

Something has been brought to our attention and we need your help. The ice machine in the kitchen is used frequently BUT sometimes in a very unsanitary manner. Please be sure you are using the scoop EVERY TIME- even if you are only getting 1 piece of ice. Your hands and cups are not sanitary and should not be used to get ice.
